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
What will 2025 bring for the NC economy?


The economic outlook is as **uncertain** as it's ever been


We appear to be approaching a **turning point** for our economy, but it's difficult to know whether the economy is headed upwards, downwards, or sideways

Three big questions we'll be asking as 2025 gets underway:

- Will Asheville's labor market recover from Hurricane Helene?
- Will labor market conditions improve for **jobseekers** across the state?
- Will we see any more relief on interest rates?







The outlook

What are our expectations for 2025?

Helene recovery: preliminary signs of improvement are a cause for optimism, but many Asheville-area residents continue to endure severe economic hardship

Labor markets: many economists are optimistic about the year to come, but we can't rule out the possibility that job-finding conditions will deteriorate further

Interest rates: borrowing costs have declined somewhat, but rates probably won't fall much further unless inflation slows or the economy crashes

How will these trends unfold in 2025? Stay tuned to find out!
