Pathways to Purpose Brunswick County

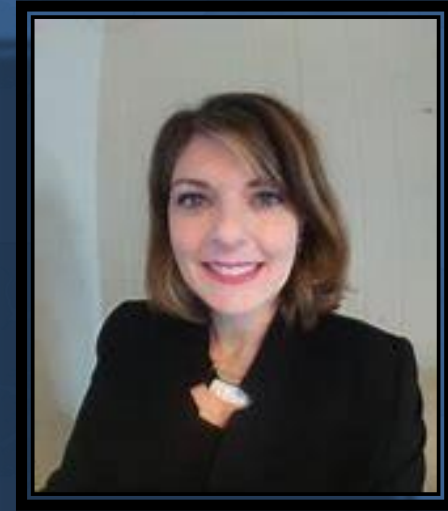
Grant Type: Implementation
Grant Amount: \$400,000

- This grant will support a program to train construction and repair workers to fix damage from Hurricane Florence.
- The project overhauls the traditional approach to delivering instruction, managing retention and awarding workforce credentials in order to keep pace with the demand on the area's construction industry.
- Partners include Brunswick Community College (project lead), Cape Fear Workforce Development Board, Brunswick Transit System, Countywide Community Development Corporation, Brunswick County Sheriff's Department/Detention Center, Brunswick County Career Center, Waccamaw Volunteer Fire Department and Sunset Beach Fire Department.

NDWG Participant Numbers - PY 2018



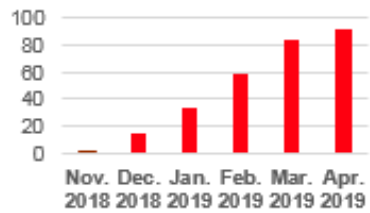

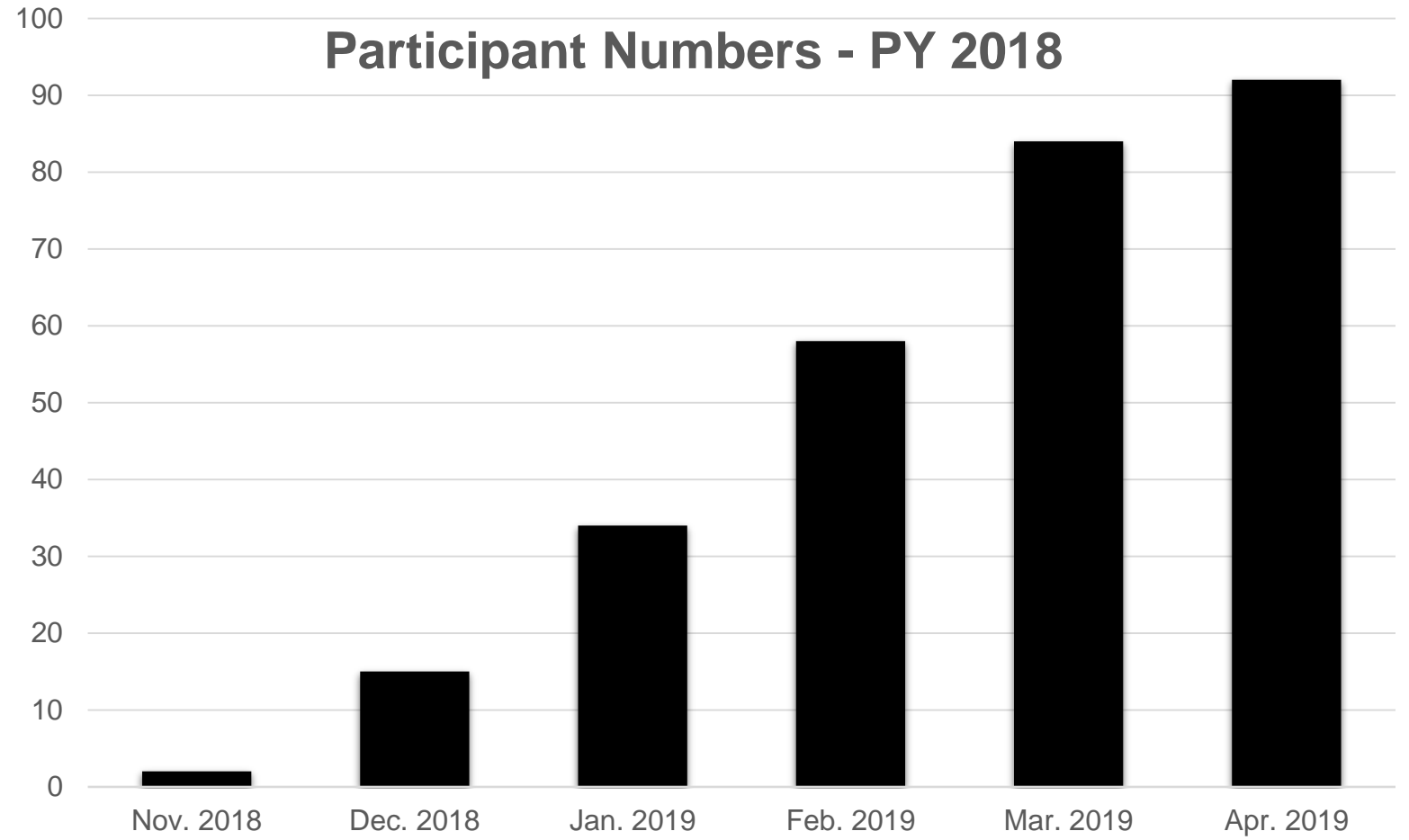
