




Top 5 Services Provided to Individuals









PROGRAM OFFERINGS

Education and Training



Participants complete a Trades Training program, WBL/Internship, and a Career Development program to learn workplace safety training, education, and employability skills for entry-level employment in the skilled trades and construction industry



Participants receive 3 credentials:

- Pre-Apprenticeship certificate
- NCCER Core Certificate
- OSHA-10 Certification



Internship opportunities with Hope Renovations or other industry partner to strengthen skills





EXPECTED OUTCOMES



EDUCATION & TRAINING

40 Women/non-binary folks from the CAWD Service Area graduate from Hope Renovations' 5-week Trades Training Program.

Goal: 40 graduated from Trades Training Program

Status: 8 trained (20% to goal)



WORK EXPERIENCE

30 Participants complete Hope Renovations' 4-week Internship Program.

Goal: 30 completed WBL

Status: 8 completed (27% to goal)



CAREER DEVELOPMENT & COACHING

20 Participants participate in Hope Renovations' Career Development Program, including 1 week of classes, and 6 group career coaching sessions bridging the transition from training to employment.

Goal: 20 completed Career Development Program

Status: 8 completed (40% to goal)



INCREASE PERSONAL CONFIDENCE

40 Participants report increase personal confidence tracked by pre- and post-program surveys

Goal: 40 reported increased confidence

Status: 4 completed (10% to goal)



EMPLOYER RECUITMENT

Recruit 5 employers to provide WBL or direct employment.

Goal: 5 employers recruited

Status: 4 recruited (80% to goal)



EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

30 Graduates of Hope Renovations' program are either employed in Construction/Skilled Trades Career or participating in an apprenticeship or related education.

Goal: 30 employed

Status: 6 employed (20% to goal)








Logic Model: Building Hope




Logic Model: OPT-IN and J.E.T.


