Perdue, Crisco lead mission to Europe

On April 26, Gov. Bev Perdue and N.C. Dept. of Commerce Sec. Keith Crisco began an important business and tourism development trip in Europe, focusing on Germany and Sweden. The governor will be in Munich through April 28, with the Commerce team continuing on to Hamburg, Berlin and Rostock, then ending the trip with client visits in Sweden.

The purpose of the trip is to recruit more jobs, investment and tourism dollars to North Carolina by meeting with senior executives of current and prospective clients in high-growth sectors including energy, life sciences and advanced manufacturing, and with tourism leaders. Scott Ralls, president of the N.C. Community College System, will showcase the state's highly regarded workforce training capabilities – an important competitive advantage for North Carolina.

Since 2001, international investment and job creation have accounted for 15 percent of all investment and jobs in North Carolina, amounting to nearly \$8 billion and the announced creation of more than 40,000 jobs. European jobs and investment have been a big part of the state's economic growth over the past 10 years.

As of press time, The Division of Tourism, Film and Sports Development is hosting a reception for 60 people including tour operators and journalists in Munich.

Cabinet maker to bring 334 jobs to Kinston

Gov. Bev Perdue on April 22 announced that MasterBrand Cabinets Inc., a national manufacturer of kitchen and bath cabinets for the remodeling and new construction markets, will expand in Lenoir County. The company plans to create 334 jobs and invest more than \$3.75 million during the next three years in Kinston. The announcement was made possible in part by a \$200,000 grant from the One North Carolina Fund. The N.C. Dept. of Commerce's Donna Phillips was the developer on this project.

"North Carolina remains home to the finest furniture and cabinet makers, an industry rapidly adapting to master the evolving challenges of a world market," said Perdue. "Our highly skilled workers, custom training programs and top quality of life continue to attract companies looking for the which also can be seen on the reverse side of N.C. Dept. of Transportation (NCDOT) is restoring full toll ferry service to Ocracoke Island this summer, adding four daily roundtrip runs that were canceled last summer because of budget cuts and increased federal staffing requirements. Starting May 25, the NCDOT Ferry Division will offer six daily roundtrips from Cedar Island, instead of the four that operated last summer. SEUS-CP wraps up in Biloxi

The annual Southeastern United States-Canadian Province Alliance (SEUS-CP) event took place in on April 11-13 in Biloxi, Miss. The theme of this year's conference was "Shared Interests-Shared Opportunities" and focused on three industry sectors: energy, geospatial technology and advanced manufacturing. The North Carolina delegation was led by Lt. Gov. Walter Dalton, who commented on the strength of the North Carolina-Canadian relationship. Canada is North Carolina's No. 1 trading partner. In 2009, over \$4.5 billion in goods was exported from North Carolina to Canada. North Carolina's Trade and Investment representative in Toronto, Russ Sawchuck, was also in attendance, along with International Trade Division Director Jean Davis

Both business and economic development delegates joined the group for the event. Local aerospace companies met one-on-one with Northrop Grumman and other companies as part of the match making and toured their facility. North Carolina had strong representation on speaking panels including presentations by Ray Jones, CEO of VX Aerospace and David Holdstock, CEO of Geographic Technologies Group. Next year's event will be held in New Brunswick, Canada, on June 12-14, 2011.

Spectrum Mills to bring 49 jobs to McDowell County

Gov. Bev Perdue announced April 26 that Spectrum Mills LLC will locate in McDowell County. The company, which will manufacture specialty textured yarns, plans to create 49 jobs and invest \$2.7 million during the next three years. The project was made possible in part by a \$135,000 grant from the One North Carolina Fund.

"North Carolina remains a top choice for companies seeking to create new jobs and enhance their successful operations," said Perdue. "Our exceptional business climate, skilled workforce and training programs continue to attract businesses and investment to our state."

Spectrum Mills is a privately owned company headquartered in Marion. The company will make textured and color polyester yarns for use in wholesale and retail applications, including sewing, needlework and piece goods. The company's predecessor was Spectrum Dyeing and Finishing, which was purchased from bankruptcy by a private investor who plans to consolidate two inactive facilities into one operation in Marion and restart production. <u>Read more</u>.

Medical supply maker to add 51 jobs in Union County

Gov. Bev Perdue announced April 21 that Greiner Bio-One North America Inc., a manufacturer and distributor of medical sampling devices and laboratory analysis technology, will create 51 jobs and invest \$25 million in Union County over the next three years. The project was made possible in part by a \$100,000 grant from the One North Carolina Fund. The N.C. Dept. of Commerce's Martyn Johnson was the developer on this project.

"This is Greiner Bio-One's second expansion since it opened in Monroe a decade ago," said Perdue. "That success reinforces North Carolina's international stature as a top location for biotech and pharmaceutical companies – a reputation that we have worked hard to earn."

Austria-based Greiner Bio-One International AG is a world leader in the field of biotechnology, diagnostics, pharmaceutical, medicine and in vitro diagnostics. It employs more than 1,200 workers in Europe, Asia, South America and the U.S.

Wholly owned subsidiary Greiner Bio-One North America currently employs 230 people with 187 of them working in Monroe. While individual salaries for the 51 new jobs will vary by job function, the overall average wage will be approximately \$28,000 a year plus benefits. <u>Read more</u>.

Alamance country Tri Vantage Breaks Ground

Tri Vantage, a distribution subsidiary of <u>Glen Raven</u>, has begun construction of a centralized distribution center in Alamance County that will serve customers throughout the U.S. The 100,000-square-foot facility is being built in the N.C. Industrial Center in Mebane with completion anticipated during the fourth quarter of this year. Glen Raven, Inc. is a global provider of fabric-based solutions, serving awning, marine, furniture, automotive and military markets worldwide.

Morganton Pressure Vessels receives One N.C. Funds

N.C. Dept. of Commerce Economic Developer Bill Payne recently presented Morganton Pressure Vessels with a partial disbursement of their One N.C. Funds. The company received a One N.C. Fund Grant on May 21, 2009, for \$129,000. The agreement called for creating 43 new jobs. So far the company has created 30, or 75 percent, of the total. Therefore they qualified for a partial payment of the award for a disbursement of \$96,750. Morganton Pressure Vessels is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Baglioni Group, which is based in Italy.

Four N.C. cities make 'best of' list

U.S. Energy Sec. Chu announces \$200M for solar, water technologies

On April 22, the 40th Anniversary of Earth Day, U.S. Dept. of Energy Sec. Steven Chu announced that the department will invest more than \$200 million over five years to expand and accelerate the development, commercialization and use of solar and water power technologies throughout the United States. This funding underscores the Administration's commitment to foster a robust clean-energy sector in the United States - that will create American manufacturing jobs and a workforce with the required technical training to speed the implementation of cutting-edge technologies. The announcement represents a down payment that will help the solar and water power industries overcome technical barriers, demonstrate new technologies, and provide support for clean energy jobs for years to come.

"Expanding the U.S. clean-energy manufacturing base is an important part of the Administration's goals to diversify electricity supply options, increase national security, and accelerate green jobs development," said Sec. Chu. "These investments will help strengthen American competitiveness in renewable energy and transform the U.S. into a lasting manufacturing presence in the 21st century clean-energy economy." <u>Read more</u>.
