Clearwater Paper to create 250 jobs in **Cleveland County**

Gov. Bev Perdue announced June 10 that Clearwater Paper Corp. plans to invest \$260 million and hire 250 workers over the next five years to build a new manufacturing and distribution facility in Shelby. The plant will make private-label tissue products for retail grocery chains throughout the Southeast and along the East Coast. The N.C. Dept. of Commerce's Rod Forsythe was the developer on this project.

"Paper making is a heritage industry in North Carolina dating back to colonial times," said Perdue. "We remain a leader in this field and others because of our top-rated business climate, our outstanding workforce, and excellent infrastructure. We welcome Clearwater Paper to North Carolina."

Clearwater Paper (NYSE:CLW) makes pulp and paperboard, private-label tissue and wood products. Its Consumer Products Division supplies more than half of the retail grocery store brand bathroom tissue, paper towels, facial tissue and napkins in the United States.

The company has private-label tissue manufacturing facilities in the West and Midwest but not in the Southeast. This new manufacturing and distribution facility is intended to help the company serve the Eastern Seaboard more cost effectively and meet growing demand.

While individual wages will vary according to job responsibilities, the overall average wage for the 250 new jobs will be approximately \$38,000. That is higher than the

Perdue: N.C. prepared if oil comes our way

Gov. Bev Perdue said today (June 15) that North Carolina is prepared if oil from the massive Deepwater Horizon leak in the Gulf of Mexico makes its way to our shores.

The governor reiterated in a press conference that North Carolina's beaches are fine and that she doesn't believe the spill will affect us, but that if it does, the state is prepared.

"Hope is not a course of action. North Carolina is very prepared for whatever comes out way," WRAL-TV quoted Perdue as saying during a meeting with legislative and local government leaders.

As of 1 p.m., the governor's Web site was featuring a live Emergency Management briefing for local officials on the state's response to the oil spill.

Magna to add 327 jobs in Rowan, Caldwell and Catawba

Gov. Bev Perdue announced June 14 that auto parts supplier Magna Composites LLC plans to expand three plants in the western part of North Carolina and create 327 new jobs over the next four years. The expansion in which Magna plans to invest \$10 million in facilities in Salisbury, Lenoir and Newton was made possible in part by a state Job Development Investment Grant. The N.C. Dept. of Commerce's Uconda Dunn was the developer on this project.

"Creating jobs is my number one priority, and this multi-county expansion is a win for the region and state," said Perdue. "North Carolina's commitment to education, workforce training and maintaining a toprated business climate makes us well positioned to continue to add jobs and economic opportunities."

Crisco, Joines participate in Beijing economic development forum

N.C. Dept. of Commerce Sec. Keith Crisco, and Winston-Salem Mayor and N.C. Economic Development Board Chairman Allen Joines were part of a trade delegation that participated in a two-day economic development forum with Chinese commerce ministers in Beijing.

The delegation was composed of 39 representatives from nine states and territories representing the American South. The event was coordinated by the Southern Governors' Association (SGA), the oldest and largest of America's regional governors' associations.

The Beijing meetings will be the first of two formal gatherings between officials from the American South and China to begin discussions on the expansion of U.S. exports to China, how to increase Chinese investment in the Southern region and how to identify partnerships between Southern and Chinese companies. In late August, Chinese provincial governors will travel to Birmingham, Ala., to meet with their American South counterparts during SGA's 2010 annual meeting to continue the trade discussions. May Economic Overview released

On June 8, the N.C. Dept. of Commerce's Policy, Research & Strategic Planning Division (PRSP) released its Monthly Overview of North Carolina's Economy for May 2010.

Among the findings:

- North Carolina's unemployment rate decreased to 10.8 percent; the number of employed workers and the labor force increased.
- Non-farm employment increased; five of 11 industry sectors increased in employment from last month.
- Closings/layoffs decreased in April and were below the four-month and 12-month averages.
- Home sales and foreclosures increased while building permits decreased.

Amtrak adds midday service between Charlotte & Raleigh

The N.C. Dept. of Transportation and Amtrak have taken train travel in North Carolina another step forward with new midday service between Raleigh and Charlotte, increasing the state-sponsored passenger rail service to six trains daily between its two largest cities. The new service launch added two additional trains in the midday, giving business travelers and families more options to travel via rail. The new service is expected to attract 43,000 new passengers in its first year of operation. The new midday trains build upon the existing Piedmont service, which now operates morning and evening trains between Raleigh and Charlotte, a trip that is auto competitive at 3 hours and 12 minutes, with intermediate stops at Cary, Durham, Burlington, Greensboro, High Point, Salisbury and Kannapolis. Cherokee is Certified Entrepreneurial Community

The Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians was recently awarded status as an AdvantageWest Certified Entrepreneurial Community (CEC). Among the participants in the ceremony were Cherokee CEC team leader Gloria Rattler and Boyce Dietz, representative for U.S. Rep. Heath Shuler, who read from the Congressional Record proclaiming Cherokee the first nation to become a Certified Entrepreneurial Community. Developed by AdvantageWest, the CEC program requires communities to complete a rigorous, five-step process to become certified, which recognizes a commitment to encourage and support entrepreneurship while improving the business climate for existing companies. The tribe joins Haywood, Transylvania, Watauga, Burke, Mitchell and Polk counties as certified communities. The CEC program, the first of its type in the country, has been presented twice before Congress and recognized at the National Consortium for Entrepreneurship Education.

N.C. joins 9 Eastern states in Wind Energy Consortium

U.S. Dept. of the Interior Sec. Ken Salazar, Gov. Bev Perdue and the governors of 9 other East Coast states on June 8 signed a Memorandum of Understanding that formally establishes an Atlantic Offshore Wind Energy Consortium to promote the efficient, orderly and responsible development of wind resources on the Outer Continental Shelf. Salazar said the establishment of the consortium will promote safe and environmentally responsible development, enhance the nation's energy security, and create jobs. He explained a regional renewable energy office has been set up to coordinate and expedite the development of wind, solar and other renewable energy resources off the Atlantic coast. Salazar in April authorized the nation's first offshore wind farm off Cape Cod. In addition to North Carolina, the other states are Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island and Virginia. Read more.
