Perdue announces 256 jobs with Semprius

Governor Bev Perdue on July 19 joined leaders of Semprius, Inc., a privately held company that produces high concentration photovoltaic solar modules, in announcing that Semprius will locate a pilot production plant in Henderson. The N.C. Department of Commerce's Bernard Torain was the developer on this project.

The project was made possible in part by state grants from the Job Development Investment Grant and One North Carolina Grant programs. To meet the targets established in these performance-based grants, the company plans to create 256 jobs over five years and make a capital investment of \$89.7 million in Henderson.

Commerce also provided Semprius with early grants through the Green Business Fund and the One N.C. Small Business Fund as it was working to commercialize its innovative process and product. These early-stage grants help companies such as Semprius by providing much-needed seed funding, and often lay the groundwork to acquire follow-on funding and expand to create jobs.

"Semprius chose to launch this cutting edge technology in North Carolina because our investments in education and worker training ensure that they can find the job-ready employees they need," said Perdue. "We welcome them to North Carolina: the smart grid capital of the world."

MVP Group to add 67 jobs in Surry County

Governor Bev Perdue on July 19 announced that MVP Group Int., a leading manufacturer of home fragrance products, will expand in Surry County. The company plans to create 67 jobs and invest \$10.6 million during the next three years in Elkin. The project was made possible in part by an \$86,000 grant from the One North Carolina Fund. The N.C. Department of Commerce's Jan Critz was the developer on this project.

"We are able to help companies like MVP expand after they have established roots in North Carolina because of our top-ranked business climate," Perdue said. "That's a direct result of our investments in education and custom training programs, creating a jobready workforce that manufacturers can rely on." Read more.

and low-cost components that can concentrate the sun's energy more than 1,100 times onto the world's smallest solar cells. The company believes its unique manufacturing processes allow Semprius to offer an advantageous cost point and execute rapid, capital-efficient expansion. Semprius will sell modules produced in the Henderson facility to global system integrators and project developers, who in turn sell complete solar systems to end users such as utility companies. Solar systems equipped with Semprius modules offer the conversion efficiency, low cost and high reliability needed to compete with fossil fuel energy generation systems and offer a viable option for achieving grid parity with fossil-based electricity.

While individual wages for the 256 jobs will vary by job function, the overall average for the new jobs will be \$45,565 a year, not including benefits. The Vance County average annual wage is \$30,004. Read more.

Roofing manufacturer to bring 10 jobs to Granville County

CertainTeed Roofing, a leading North American manufacturer of asphalt roofing products, will build a new rail unloading and storage facility in Granville County. The company plans to create 10 jobs and invest \$20 million during the next three years in Oxford. The project was made possible in part by a \$30,000 grant from the One North Carolina Fund. The N.C. Department of Commerce's Bernard Torain was the developer on this project.

"Companies like CertainTeed Roofing want to set up shop in North Carolina because our path to the future is clear," said Governor Bev Perdue. "We have invested in education, transportation and infrastructure to build a well-trained workforce and an environment where businesses can thrive. CertainTeed Roofing is a subsidiary of CertainTeed Corporation, a leading North American manufacturer of interior and exterior building products and is a subsidiary of French-based Saint-Gobain, the world's largest building materials company. CertainTeed currently employs 503 people in North Carolina, including 266 Roofing employees in Granville County. The company will build a new railcar unloading and storage facility in Oxford that will enable the company to get asphalt from other sources while increasing production of residential asphalt roofing shingles. Lee Industries to expand in Catawba County

Lee Industries, a higher-priced upholstery manufacturer with headquarters in Catawba County, recently announced it would expand by purchasing and renovating the former Conover Chair facility in Conover. Once the renovations are complete in May 2012, the company will add 75 new production jobs at the facility. The project is being supported in part by a loan through the Community Development Block Grant Building Reuse program which is being applied for by the City of Conover and by a local incentives grant from Catawba County. The company has a capital budget of \$2.5 million for the project. Lee was established in 1969 and currently employs some 490 in the headquarters and three Catawba County manufacturing facilities. The N.C. Department of Commerce's Ron Leitch was the developer on the project.

Tourism leaders participate in U.K. Sales & Media mission

The N.C. Department of Commerce's Division of Tourism, Film and Sports Development continued its international marketing efforts with a recent sales and media mission to London and Dublin led by International Marketing Manager Heidi Walters and Public Relations Manager Margo Metzger. Several industry partners also attended the mission including representatives from Cabarrus County CVB, Visit Charlotte, Asheville CVB, Durham CVB and Grandfather Mountain. The sales group met with 15 tour operators including established tour operator partners, as well as training at Wexas. The group worked with tour operators with existing North Carolina product to expand their offerings, and also met with tour operators who currently do not package North Carolina in an effort to get them to expand their destination offerings. In addition, the group introduced North Carolina to three new tour operators: Grandstand Tours specializing in motorsports tours, British Airway Tours now in partnership promoting the American Airlines RDU flight, and Black Tomato, specializing in

State launches program to help small businesses with trust taxes

The N.C. Department of Revenue, along with the N.C. Small Business Commissioners Office, is launching a program that aims to help small businesses recover from certain tax liability issues they may have suffered as a result of the current economic downturn.

The Small Business Taxpayer Recovery Program will offer penalty and fee waivers, as well as payment plans to companies that have fallen behind on sales, withholding and other trust taxes.

"The recent recession has caused financial difficulties for many small businesses in North Carolina," said N.C. Department of Revenue Secretary David Hoyle. "One of our agency goals is to be firm and fair, while still being compassionate. This program does that, by offering us a tool to collect taxes due the State, while at the same time helping struggling businesses get back on their feet.

Businesses with 200 or fewer employees qualify for the program and must agree to use the counseling services of the **Small Business** and Technology Development Center or the N.C. Small Business Center Network. For more than 25 years, the SBTDC and SBCN have helped thousands of owners improve their businesses. The SBTDC, a business advisory service of the University of North Carolina System, provides personalized management counseling designed to help small and mid-sized businesses with strategy, financing, marketing and performance improvement. The SBCN, operated through the N.C. Community College System, provides potential and current small business owners with free business counseling services, small business start-up and management training, and resource and referral services.

Both organizations will be available to assist participating small business taxpayers with financial planning and other business needs. All services are confidential and protected from public information requests. Read more.

The media group met with 31 national and regional media outlets, pitching story ideas and news about new attractions, events and more. In addition, North Carolina had a booth at the Goodwood Festival of Speed introducing U.K. racing fans to North Carolina. More than 800 visitors stopped by for more information over the three-day event. Traditionally, international visitors spend more and stay longer than domestic visitors. In 2010 the U.K. market sent 83,501 visitors to North Carolina, spending \$32.5 million -- an average of \$390 per person.



Summer tourism season off to strong start in WNC

Whether they're whitewater thrill-seekers, campers looking for a leafy getaway or camera-toting visitors looking to learn about the region's history, visitors have arrived to the Asheville area. Anecdotal reports, early economic indicators and other factors, hint that Western North Carolina's tourism industry will do at least as well as last year and may well exceed it. Hotel sales in Buncombe County -- one key barometer -- have been positive for eight of the last nine months, according to the Asheville CVB, which is predicting a 5 percent increase in room tax revenue.
