Perdue announces 62 green jobs in North ampton County

Governor Bev Perdue and officials from Enviva LP on Aug. 4 announced plans to construct a new wood pellet manufacturing plant in Garysburg that will employ 62 people.

Enviva is a leading manufacturer of highquality utility scale wood pellets. These pellets are used by energy companies to reduce emissions of carbon dioxide at coal fired power plants. The wood pellets manufactured at the facility in Garysburg will be used in power plants across the United States and Europe. The project was made possible in part by a state grant from the One North Carolina grant program.

"North Carolina is quickly becoming a hub for alternative energy solutions," said Perdue.
"Our terrific business climate, skilled workforce and diverse natural resources make North Carolina an excellent location for the growing biomass industry and other alternative energy producers. Enviva will be a great addition for Northampton County."

This is Enviva's second facility in North Carolina. In October, another Enviva manufacturing plant in Ahoskie will open with 53 employees. Read more.

State Energy Office holds Smart Grid Forum

Today, (Aug. 9) the N.C. Department of Commerce's State Energy Office held a Smart Grid Forum for North Carolina at the Friday Center at UNC-Chapel Hill. Following opening remarks by N.C. Department of Commerce Secretary Keith Crisco, there were sessions on N.C. Energy Demographics, Smart Grid 101, and Community Development. This afternoons sessions are Integrating Renewable Sources, Cyber Security and Policy and Industry Round-Up.

A smart grid is an electricity distribution system that incorporates two-way digital communications technology to manage grid stability, control appliances, and reduce costs. This forum brings industry leaders, local policy-makers and utility representatives together to discuss smart grid issues relevant to North Carolina.


Commerce awards community development grants

The N.C. Department of Commerce has awarded two Community Development Block Grants to North Carolina communities. The City of Conover has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$750,000 to loan to Lee Industries for renovating a vacant industrial building. The company has pledged to create 38 new jobs and invest \$3 million over a two-year period.

Also, the town of Haw River has been approved for a grant in the amount of \$160,000 to loan to Franklin Products Inc. for renovating a vacant industrial building. The company has pledged to create eight new jobs and invest more than \$800,000 over a two-year period.

N.C. Zoo completes solar project

The N.C. Zoo, in partnership with Carolina Solar Energy, completed a solar energy project that involves 9,600 square feet of solar collectors mounted on three large picnic pavilions. This array has the capacity to generate 104 kilowatts of electricity. CSE is selling the electricity to the electric grid via the Randolph Electric Membership Corporation and receives incentive payments from N.C. Green Power for the renewable energy. Learn more.

Grant to help build marine biotech innovation center

The N.C. Biotechnology Center has approved a four-year, \$2.5 million grant to establish a Marine Biotechnology Center of Innovation to accelerate development of commercial products from the state's marine life using the tools of biotechnology.

Mary Beth Thomas, vice president of the Centers of Innovation program at the Biotechnology Center, said a key feature of the COI program is "to capture and leverage the diverse strengths of North Carolina's unique regions in ways that will grow a targeted industry sector leading to a stronger economy and the creation of good jobs."
